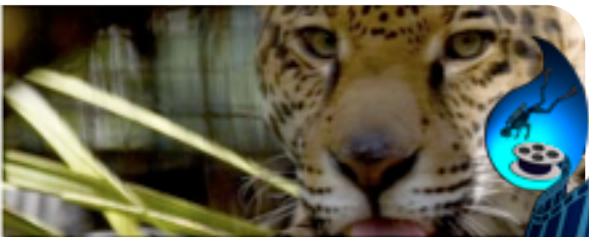

**ESTEEMED, WORLD RENOWNED 'SMITHSONIAN' TO HOST LIQUID MOTION FILM...**

WASHINGTON D.C - The esteemed **SMITHSONIAN National Museum of Natural History** is the latest venue to screen [Liquid Motion's](#) films - In synchrony with the brand new Blue Chip Underwater Series **WATER COLOURS (6x26')**, three short 'episode teasers' were produced - 'Fisheye Fantasea', 'Colour Talks' & 'Beyond The Blue'. Containing landmark new science and rapidly garnering top Awards and international acclaim, the shorts were hailed as 'stand alone' films and continue to be requested for screening worldwide.

Seating over 560 guests, FISHEYE FANTASEA & COLOUR TALKS are to screen on March 14 at [The Smithsonian's Baird Auditorium](#), as Finalists of The Environmental Film Festival of The Nations Capital. "It's hard to get more prestigious than The Smithsonian", says Director Guy Chaumette. "We couldn't be prouder".

The three shorts are all finalists, nominated for a ROSCAR Award at the forthcoming Wild Talk Film Festival, South Africa, alongside films such as the BBC's Meerkats, OTF's Monkey Thieves and Rick Rosenthal's Superfish. Last weekend brought a Silver Medal from Chicago and a Golden Dolphin Award from Moscow, bringing a current total of 25 Major International Awards and numerous prestigious nominations worldwide for these films.
